IMPORTANTLY! You have the experiences for the work

When TRANSLATING your work into a resume or talking about it, think about:

Breaking down the process

Describing individual steps

#### SOME EXAMPLES...

Your **TEACHING** Experience

Developed syllabus

Delivered content/taught the class

Developed assessments to gauge understanding

Translating the experience for training & technical assistance work

Identified critical topics, collated relevant materials, and designed curriculum

Transferred knowledge and information through multiple formats (presentation, development of deliverables)

Gauged understanding of topics and modified materials to reinforce important materials and lessons

#### **RESEARCHING** with faculty

Conducted Literature Reviews

Managed Data & Conducted Analysis

Assisted with report and manuscript writing, and conference presentation

### Translating the experience for research & project-based work

Collated existing research on various topics, identified research gaps in the knowledge base, helped develop critical questions to answer gaps, wrote summaries of research within quick deadlines

Managed primary and secondary quantitative data, and qualitative data adhering to confidentiality and security protocols, conducted mixed-methods analysis using SPSS and Atlas.ti, respectively

Developed materials for various audiences in various formats including, technical reports, peer-reviewed publications, conference presentations, and podcasts

#### Your **DISSERTATION**

Identified important research area to fill specific need

Developed methodology and executed research project

### Translating the experience for any place, really

Identified critically important problem and described scope of the problem, developed necessary research question grounded in theory and policy context to help answer problem. Authored all IRB paperwork and worked with agency for data use agreement.

Developed mixed-methodology to answer research question. Worked with agency research department to understand administrative data available, collected needed data and built additional variables, as necessary. Developed numerous interview instruments for incarcerated persons and prison staff. Served as liaison to prison staff to coordinate site visits and data collection protocols. Trained and managed 12 young researchers on data collectins. Developed rapport with prison officials to conduct 100 semi-structured interviews inside restricted housing units

#### Your **DISSERTATION**

Interpreted findings to address previously identified need and contribute to larger body of research

### Translating the experience for any place, really

Organized and managed quantitative and qualitative data. Used various statistical software to conduct iterative analyses.

Presented findings directly to agency staff and provided important practical recommendations. Authored agency final report.

Authored three peer-reviewed publications situating the findings from the work into the larger policy and practice context to provide meaningful answers to important questions.



MIMIC the language of the position positing!

**DETAIL** areas of responsibility and role centrality

**DRAW ATTENTION** to areas of skill refinement

**HIGHLIGHT** unexpected skills

Graphic Design → Development of Infographics
Audio & Video Editing → Training videos & podcasts
"Alternative" project management and applied work
Experience with budgeting and/or cost estimation

Important for getting you in the door and salary negotiations!

# PAUSE ANY QUESTIONS?

#### RESUME vs CV?!?!

Research-based spaces likely to ask for both (think: Urban, Vera, RTI, Rand, Pew...)

#### **RESUME** concerns

- Length (1-3 pp)
- Language Avoid jargon, ground your experience in action verbs!
- Focus EMPHASIZE experiences over research outcomes (e.g. publications)



- Make your own decisions about format and sections to include
- Show your personality! But, also recognize need for parsimony!
- Every resume you submit should vary based upon the position. No two resumes are created the same.

#### THAT COVER LETTER, THO

- Reference the organization and position
- Explicitly discuss areas of alignment
- Focus more on applied research and direct work with agencies, and your approach to translational research
- Avoid jargon and prepare your materials for a general audience
- If it feels right... offer questions you'd love to explore or ideas you're passionate about
- SPOILER ALERT: If you do info interviews, you can ask for cover letter pointers
- Be strategic about references



#### MORE PROTIPS!

**ORGANIZE** resume/CV sections based upon priorities of specific Alt Ac spaces



RESEARCH FIRM: Grants, Reports, Data Management Experiences, Mixed Audience Presentations, Convening Stakeholders experiences, Peer-Review Publications



AGENCY SETTING: Experiences working with admin data, grant work/proposal development, technical reports/presentations, deemphasize peer-reviewed pubs



ADVOCACY ORGS: EXPERIENCES! Especially working in community and with stakeholders, writing for general audiences, grant work/proposal development, deemphasize peer-reviewed pubs

FLEX electronic resume skills, embedded links for example

#### **COLLECT EXAMPLES!** Get inspired, #inspo

Go down the internet rabbit hole and find examples

Look for examples from people in similar positions, **PEEP THEIR LINKEDINS FOR MORE INSPO** 

Get feedback and revise!

Think about how you're perceived. **BUILD RAPPORT**. Write down "moments" for later. You're kinda already interviewing for that job you may or may not want there.
