Prof. Brandon L. Garrett invites applications for a one-year, Criminal Justice Research and Policy Post-Doctoral Fellowship, with the possibility for an additional one-year extension. This fellowship is intended for individuals with a doctoral degree (JD, PhD, MD, DPhil) who are interested in an academic or policy career working on issues in science and law, with a particular interest in studying data and outcomes in the criminal justice system. Projects may include research on state sentencing data, mental health diversion, drug treatment, eyewitness memory, scientific evidence in the courtroom, and the use of risk assessment in criminal cases. The fellow will take part in the work of the JustScience Lab at Duke Law School, which conducts empirical criminal justice research, and work with the Wilson Center for Science and Justice at Duke.

Mentored research opportunities. The postdoctoral research fellow will work closely with Prof. Brandon Garrett and other faculty mentors at Duke University to conduct research at the intersection of science, law, and criminal justice policy. The fellow will also obtain knowledge and skills necessary to obtain competitive research funding, in preparation for a successful career.

Project management and leadership experience. The postdoctoral research fellow will be in charge of coordinating and leading research projects focusing on criminal justice data and outcomes, including in North Carolina. The fellow, along with the team of post-docs and grad students, will help with coordinating and leading weekly JustScience Lab team meetings, and engaging with the broader Duke community as well as outside government and community stakeholders to foster research collaborations. The fellow will collaborate, supervise, and mentor undergraduates, graduates, and other post-docs working with these projects.

Educational opportunities. The fellow will have access to relevant law school and Duke University events and seminars.

#### Fellowship Responsibilities

- Complete at least one mentored research project which culminates in a manuscript of publishable quality
- Participate in science, law, and criminal justice policy conferences, workshops, and seminars as appropriate
- Support the policy work of the JustScience Lab and related research projects, including by participating in education and engagement opportunities, such as presentations and meetings with lawmakers, prosecutors, defense attorneys, and policy reform coalition members
- Help plan and implement workshops and events within and outside of the Duke and local communities.

#### Qualifications

Must have a JD, PhD, MD, or equivalent doctoral degree in computer science, economics, neuroscience, political science, psychology, statistics, sociology, criminal justice or a field deemed relevant by the program. Must have excellent written and oral communication skills and must be able to work in collaborative, team-oriented environments. Substantial experience with statistical methods is highly desirable, as well as experience with programming and analyses of complex datasets. Experience with social science research methods, including survey methods, quantitative and qualitative research, and/or policy research is also desirable. Familiarity with criminal justice-related data is also preferred.



traneworks to guide my research. This research is a longitudinal, qualitative examination of patterns of desistance and persistence among a sample of sex offenders. My dissertation consists of a second interview with a qualitative sample of the original 76 sex offenders in the NIJ grant entitled *Sex Offender Residency Restrictions*. These interviews explore the effects of state residency restrictions on offender supervision, their success or failure, and their quality of life three years after the initial interview. Thus far, I have interviewed 29 of the original participants, some of whom are in prison, on parole or off supervision. In these interviews, I obtain a recounting of events over the past three years and examine how life transitions and events may

#### COVER LETTER POSTDOC

Over the course of my graduate career I have worked on numerous federally and locally funded grants, involving both quantitative and qualitative methods, and various offender groups. While at UMSL, I have worked with Dr. Huebner on a National Institute of Justice grant entitled *Sex Offender Residency Restrictions*, which examined the effects of policies pertaining to sex offender residency in Michigan and Missouri. In this project, I have prepared data for analysis, assisted in statistical analyses including mapping through ArcGIS, collected in-depth interviews with offenders, and coded and analyzed qualitative data. I was also responsible for report writing, conference presentations, and manuscript preparation. This research consisted of parallel studies in Michigan and Missouri that allow for comparing and contrasting findings. First, we used data on sex offenders before and after the implementation of residency restrictions; however they did move residences more often as compared to non-sex offenders. This research has resulted in a technical report provided to the National Institute of Justice and a manuscript, which is forthcoming in *Criminology and Public Policy*.

In addition to analysis of the longitudinal data, we also conducted in-depth interviews with sex offenders and non-sex offenders in Missouri and Michigan. Qualitative analysis contextualized the various regression and mapping analyses by identifying the nature and quality of life of offenders who resided in Missouri and Michigan under the restriction laws. Some results from this research are presented in an

#### **EXAMPLE:**

In addition to my research experiences in my Master's and Doctoral programs, I have also benefited from working in the field of corrections. Upon completion of my Master's degree, I was employed as a Probation and Parole Officer with the Missouri Department of Corrections for three years. I served as a liaison between the Jackson County Circuit Court, Division of Probation and Parole, and offenders who had absconded from supervision. I experienced many facets of the criminal justice system including court procedures, the law of corrections, offender supervision and evidence-based interventions. This first-hand experience is what inspired me to return to academia and pursue a research agenda that has implications for both criminological theory and criminal justice policy making.


