Ntasha's training and experience have enabled her to connect the worlds of research and practice, arriving at context-specific, evidence-based solutions for different issues. Her contributions to the field are published in **Feminist Criminology**, the **Journal of Research on Crime and Delinquency**, and the **European Journal of Criminology**. Over the past year, she has worked as a UN Women Technical Consultant to the Ministry of Women and Child Development, applying a gender lens to India's G20 Presidency. Currently, as a UN Women Technical Consultant to the Government of Goa, she is building the state's strategy on creating enabling ecosystems for safety.
